


FAMILY TIES




BRAVE SPACE—FEBRUARY 27TH—6:00-8:00PM

THE PROPERTY TEAM HAS TWO BIG-TICKET PROJECTS MARKED FOR 2022 that we are bringing forward in hopes that members of the congregation would like to financially support these projects.



REPLACING THE BLUE CARPET IN THE UPSTAIRS HALLWAY: This project has been talked about for over a decade and this will be the year the change happens. A few professional estimates brought the project in at about \$7000. The property team is exploring their options, including if they can logistically do the project themselves using carpet squares. As the project is being planned out, church family support for the project will be welcomed. Whether the project is completed with professionals or with church members' sweat and tears, there will be a decent expense with the upgrade.

POURING NEW CEMENT AT THE CHURCH OFFICE ENTRANCE AND BY THE MAINTENANCE SHED: The cement in this area has been settling, causing odd angles, cracks, uneven squares and crumbling. This entrance, which is also our handicapped accessible entry, could pose as a liability problem to those who utilize it. Preliminary professional bids for this project are coming in around \$5000.

LETTER FROM THE LEADERSHIP TEAM

In response to Wisconsin Council of Churches call to go virtual, if possible.





To the Church Family of Peace Lutheran Church,

On January 5th the Wisconsin Council of Churches released a memo that urged congregations to temporarily move to all online forums to help curb the spread of COVID. The memo can be found here: CLICK HERE

The Leadership Team of Peace Lutheran Church has read and discussed this memo. The Leadership Team has considered the current mitigation measures that are in place at Peace Lutheran Church, the needs of their attending church family and the online options that are currently being offered to the non-attending members of our church family. At this time, Peace Lutheran Church will continue with the 9 AM in-person worship services on Sunday morning while continuing to offer online services through Facebook for those who opt to worship from home.

Please note, we are continuing with in-person services trusting in our church family to continue to mask while gathered in the sanctuary. Additionally we are asking people to proactively refrain from in-person services if you have COVID, are living in a household with COVID, are experiencing COVID-like symptoms, or if your general health would be at risk if you or someone you live with contracted COVID.

Please be aware that we are offering options to our church family whether you choose to worship from home or in the sanctuary. There is an 8 AM Facebook Live session on Sundays led by seminary student Sommer Johnson-Loar. The 9 AM in-person service, which averages about 55 attendees in a sanctuary built to accommodate near to 300, is shared live on Facebook each Sunday morning and then emailed out each Sunday afternoon. If you choose to attend in person, mitigation supplies are available at each entrance—hand sanitizer, a face mask, and communion supplies for communing from your own pew.

In closing, we would like to share a closing remark from a communication from Rev. Jenn Pockat, Associate to the Bishop which she shared on Tuesday January 11th along with the Wisconsin Council of Churches' memo to our synod: Even though it might feel like it, it's not solely up to you and you aren't going to "ruin the church." The Holy Spirit is not going to abandon you now and neither are your siblings in Christ throughout and across the synod. The church of Christ is a church of resurrection. The beautiful body of Christ, broken for you, is resilient and can withstand it all - even if people are disappointed - even if people leave - even if there is conflict - the Spirit is sustaining and renewing this church. This is the heart of our proclamation, even in death. We're going to make it through this time. In the moments of boldness, courage, or stillness - there is plenty of grace from God for you. That's a decision you don't have to make! There is plenty of hope, too - in Christ.

PEACE CONTRIBUTES TO MISSION SUPPORT

If you are like me from a few years back, you may not be aware that Peace Lutheran Church is a strong supporter of Mission Support. This means that aside from what our church teams do in the community, our congregation strongly supports the larger missions of the ELCA synod. Each month, we share 10% of our tithe to the synod office.

HOW YOUR OFFERING BECOMES MISSION SUPPORT

As Lutherans, we believe that Christ has freed us from sin and death, and even from ourselves, so that we can love and serve our neighbors. One way we turn our faith into action is by making a financial gift — an offering — to our congregation.

Each year, ELCA congregations pledge to send a portion of their offerings to fund ELCA ministries in their synods and beyond. We call these funds Mission Support. Mission Support enables the ELCA's more than 8,900 congregations and 65 synods to pool resources to love and serve our neighbors in ways that no individual or congregation can do alone. Mission Support is one way we are church together — it's essential to who we are as the ELCA. Through Mission Support, we expand our participation in God's life-changing work in our communities and around the world.

HOW MISSION SUPPORT FUNDS MINISTRY ACROSS OUR CHURCH



Your congregation's Mission Support dollars are stewarded by your synod's leaders to nurture and equip ELCA congregations and rostered ministers. Synods support area ministry partners — camps, colleges, seminaries and more — and build relationships with global-companion churches. Synods designate a portion of the Mission Support funds they receive from congregations to be shared with the churchwide organization for ministries across our church.

The "Eighth Street Church" has long been a part of the community of Oshkosh on the south side of the Fox River.

Currently our Ministry Site Profile team is working hard to define who we are today. To recognize the church business was all conducted in German and know that has all slowly transformed, is an amazing fact.

This stone was recently found beneath an old safe in a cement room in the basement level of the education hallways. From reading a church book printed in 1960, my best guess is that this stone was part of the edifice of the new church construction that was dedicated on October 25, 1874. It can now be viewed on the wall of the Fireside Room.

Isaiah 6:8

⁸Then I heard the voice of the Lord saying, "Whom shall I send, and who will go for us?" And I said, "Here am I; send me!"

Isaiah wasn't perfect and he knew it. But when God called, Isaiah stepped up and did exactly what God asked of him. There are lots of opportunities for me to step up and do what I know in my heart God wants me to do. Lord, help me recognize those opportunities, and give me the strength to step up.

Jeremiah 17:7-8

⁷Blessed are those who trust in the Lord, whose trust is the Lord. ⁸They shall be like a tree planted by water, sending out its roots by the stream. It shall not fear when heat comes, and its leaves shall stay green; in the year of drought, it is not anxious, and it does not cease to bear fruit.

Luke 6:27-28
