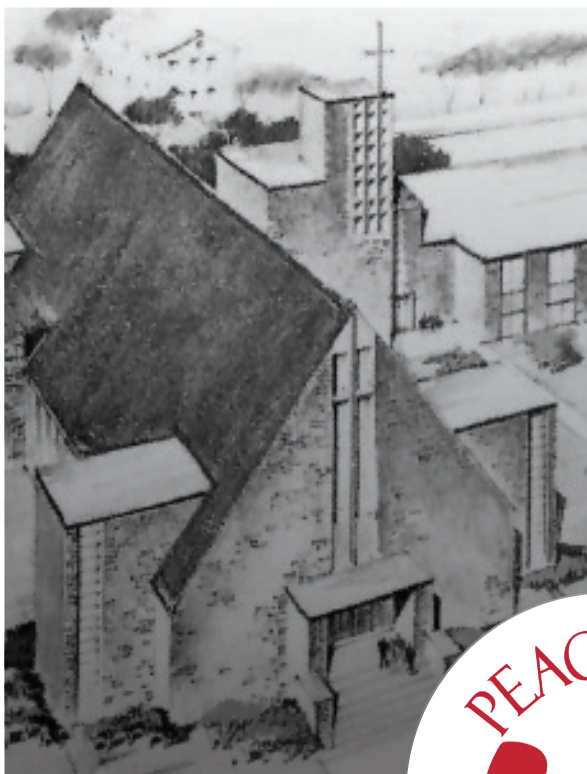

# FROM THE PASTOR

---



Greetings people of Peace Lutheran Church, I am thrilled to finally be here with you!

*I came to town a few days ahead of the rest of my family, and a couple of weeks ahead of the majority of our stuff, since we have to wait until we close on our house to have anywhere to put it. As I left, I packed up the car with some things we don't want to put on the moving truck and clothes for this in-between time. After all of that, I only had room for two more boxes, which I was going to take from the stack that goes to my office. Because it had been a few weeks since I had packed the boxes, I didn't know what was in them, so I simply grabbed two and hoped for the best.*

*It turns out that they were not particularly helpful. One contained a cross for the wall and some framed pictures. The other was filled with miscellaneous papers and odds and ends of things I wasn't quite sure what to do with as I packed. I couldn't help but laugh as I unpacked those two mystery boxes when I realized how useless they were. I'll be honest, I feel a bit unmoored as I wait for the rest of my books.*

*We are often waiting for something. It's such a common part of life that the mothers and fathers of our faith have even carved out a section of our church year to be specifically dedicated to waiting, and we are in it! Welcome to Advent.*

*Advent is a season of waiting and watching. We wait and watch in both directions: forward to the end of time, and backwards in history to Jesus' birth. As we wait and watch, we are reminded to rejoice because God is near. We are invited to be still to feel the nearness of God, and encouraged to get ready for the coming of Christ.*

*But ready or not, God is drawing near. So if it turns out that the boxes you grabbed in preparation are as incredibly useless as mine ended up being, Christ is born to us nonetheless. God comes in the flesh, whether we have the right stuff or not. That's the scandal of the gospel. That's the good news. Nothing can stop God from drawing near to you and bringing you joy, peace, hope, love, and new life.*

*In the church we wait and watch for God by gathering together more often, with the addition of midweek services throughout Advent. We light candles to help us mark the passing of time with more intention and to usher in the light of Christ who meets us in the manger.*

*I hope you will join me throughout Advent on Sunday mornings and Wednesday evenings. I look forward to getting to know you all. What a joy it was to look through the welcome basket and to be greeted by such kindness and generosity. Thank you for your grace as I get settled into life in Oshkosh and ministry at Peace. Most of all thank you for sharing in the ministry with me.*

---

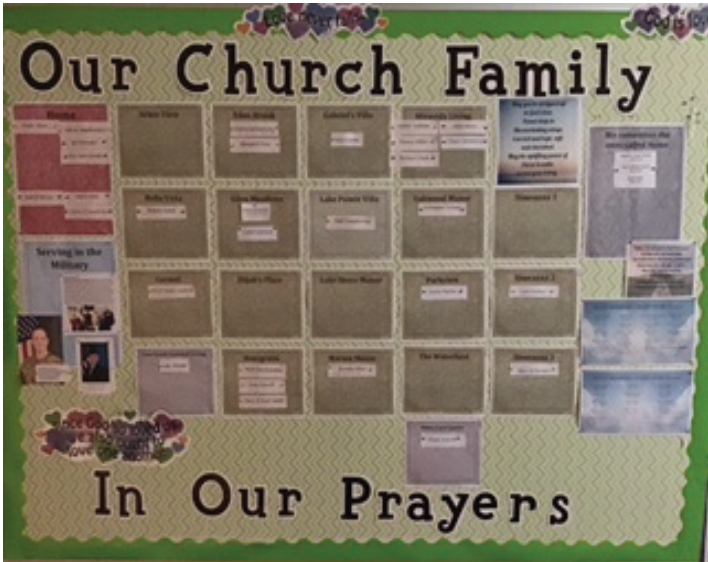

# REFLECTIONS ON GOD'S WORD

---

Below are verses from December's Bible readings that made me stop and ask, "What is this telling me about my relationship with God and other people?" When time allows, re-visit the Sunday Bible readings. Look for verses that help answer that question for you.

## Week of December 4, 2022

**Isaiah 11:1 & 10** 1 A shoot shall come out from the stump of Jesse, and a branch shall grow out of his roots. 10 On that day the root of Jesse shall stand as a signal to the peoples; the nations shall inquire of him, and his dwelling shall be glorious.

*Questions about who Jesus really was cross my mind from time to time. But then I come across Bible verses like those in the December readings that answer my questions. More than 700 years before the birth of Christ, God was promising the Israelites that he would send them a savior. And, He tells them exactly how to recognize that savior.*

## Week of December 11, 2022

**Matthew 11:2-6** 2 When John heard in prison what the Messiah was doing, he sent word by his disciples 3 and said to him, "Are you the one who is to come, or are we to wait for another?" 4 Jesus answered them, "Go and tell John what you hear and see: 5 the blind receive their sight, the lame walk, the lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have good news brought to them. 6 And blessed is anyone who takes no offense at me."

*By all accounts, Jesus checked all the boxes that identified him as the savior God had promised. Yet, even John the Baptist wasn't 100% sure. So, Jesus tells John the Baptist, his disciples, and us that he is, indeed, the fulfillment of God's promise.*

## Week of December 18, 2022

**Romans 1:1-6** 1 Paul, a servant of Jesus Christ, called to be an apostle, set apart for the gospel of God, 2 which he promised beforehand through his prophets in the holy scriptures, 3 the gospel concerning his Son, who was descended from David according to the flesh 4 and was declared to be Son of God with power according to the spirit of holiness by resurrection from the dead, Jesus Christ our Lord, 5 through whom we have received grace and apostleship to bring about the obedience of faith among all the Gentiles for the sake of his name, 6 including yourselves who are called to belong to Jesus Christ.

*Even after his death and resurrection, some of Jesus's followers didn't know who he really was. So, God continued to remind people through the words and actions of the apostles that Jesus was, and is, the fulfillment of His promise to send us a savior.*

## Week of December 25, 2022

**Titus 3:4-7** 4 When the goodness and loving kindness of God our Savior appeared, 5 he saved us, not because of any works of righteousness that we had done, but according to his mercy, through the water of rebirth and renewal by the Holy Spirit. 6 This Spirit he poured out on us richly through Jesus Christ our Savior, 7 so that, having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs according to the hope of eternal life.

*So, why is the birth we celebrate on Christmas Day so important? Christ's birth, death, and resurrection fulfilled God's promise that His love and forgiveness are gifts freely given to us by Him.*
