# FROM THE PASTOR

Christmas is a season in the church year that lasts 12 days. It starts on Christmas day and stretches to January 6th which marks Epiphany. Epiphany means "manifestation" and is the day we celebrate when Christ was revealed to all the nations with the story of the visit of Magi, or wise men, to Jesus. The 12-day season of Christmas is pretty much a thing of the past in our country as Christmas creeps closer and closer to Halloween in the stores so that by the time the actual church season comes around, we are sick of the carols, and the cookies, and the decorations. Even in our churches, we tend to mash the story together with wise men and shepherds and angels all next to each other. (Though, kudos to this year's Sunday school Christmas program which referenced how including wise men with the shepherds and angels isn't quite biblically accurate!)

Oftentimes, I can stretch it to New Year's Day before I put away the Christmas decorations, switch off the Christmas music and go back to "life as usual." Rarely do I make it to Epiphany. But as is often the case, the Spirit, through the church, invites us to linger a little longer in the story of God coming to dwell with us, and I am reminded that Christmas is more than decorations, songs, and presents.

Author, theologian, educator and civil rights leader Howard Thurman wrote this poem in his book The Mood of Christmas and Other Celebrations called "The Work of Christmas" as a reflection of what comes next:

When the song of the angels is stilled, when the star in the sky is gone, when the kings and princes are home, when the shepherds are back with their flocks, the work of Christmas begins: to find the lost, to heal the broken, to feed the hungry, to release the prisoner, to rebuild the nations, to bring peace among the people, to make music in the heart.

We have work to do as the people of God's church in this time and place - the work of Christmas; the work of Christ, God with us. Let's get to it!

My first month with you has been filled with so much joy and warmth. You are a community full of many gifts and passions to share. I look forward to discovering together the work of Christmas God is calling us to as a community of faith. It is a privilege to serve as your pastor. May the peace, joy, love and hope that comes to us at Christmas carry you into the new year.

# **REFLECTIONS ON GOD'S WORD**

Below are verses from December's Bible readings that made me stop and ask, "What is this telling me about my relationship with God and other people?" When time allows, re-visit the Sunday Bible readings. Look for verses that help answer that question for you.

### Week of January 1, 2023

**Psalm 8:1** 10 Lord our Lord, how majestic is your name in all the earth!

Every once in a while, I have to stop and evaluate my prayers. More often than not, I find that most of my prayers are asking God for something. I forget to praise God for how wonderful He is. Psalm 8 reminds me of why I need to acknowledge that.

### Week of January 8, 2023

Acts 10:34-35, 43 4Peter began to speak to [Cornelius and his household]: "I truly understand that God shows no partiality, 35but in every nation anyone who fears him and does what is right is acceptable to him. 43All the prophets testify about him that everyone who believes in him receives forgiveness of sins through his name."

Anyone and everyone who fears God, does what is right and acceptable to Him AND anyone and everyone who believes in Jesus's death and resurrection, is my brother or sister in God's sight... regardless of earthly differences. I pray that God develops in me a love that enables me to treat others as true siblings in Christ.

### Week of January 15, 2023

**Psalm 40:7,8,10** And so I said, "Here I am; I come. In the scroll of the book it is written of me: 8'I love to do your will, O my God; your law is deep within me.' "10I have not hidden your righteousness in my heart; I have spoken of your faithfulness and your deliverance; I have not concealed your steadfast love and truth from the great assembly.

These are the things I should want to do in thankfulness for the love God shows me and the sacrifices His son made on my behalf. I just need God to help me live my life in the way He expects.

# Week of January 22, 2023

**Psalm 27:1** 1The Lord is my light and my salvation; whom then shall I fear? The Lord is the stronghold of my life; of whom shall I be afraid?

The psalmists do a wonderful job explaining why I should be thankful to be counted among God's children.

# Week of January 29, 2023

**Micah 6:8** He has told you, O mortal, what is good; and what does the Lord require of you but to do justice, and to love kindness, and to walk humbly with your God?

**Psalm 15** 1Lord, who may dwell in your tabernacle? Who may abide upon your holy hill? 2Those who lead a blameless life and do what is right, who speak the truth from their heart; 3they do not slander with the tongue, they do no evil to their friends; they do not cast discredit upon a neighbor. 4In their sight the wicked are rejected, but they honor those who fear the Lord. They have sworn upon their health and do not take back their word. 5They do not give their money in hope of gain, nor do they take bribes against the innocent. Those who do these things shall never be overthrown.

Until I started really thinking about Bible verses for these reflections, I never realized how often God reminds the Israelites, and us, of His expectations and how we can repay Him for the love he shows us. God must have known how easy it would be for us to forget.
