FROM THE PRESIDENT

In 1986, the congregation of Peace undertook a bold mission. They established an endowment fund. Unlike most endowments where the funds are used to benefit the organization, Peace's endowment was intended to support activities outside of Peace, to enhance the mission outreach of Peace's congregation. To insure this, Peace's constitution states:

This income from this ENDOWMENT FUND is to enhance the Mission Outreach Ministry of Peace Lutheran Church apart from the Current Ministry (Annual Operating Budget) of the congregation, and that no portion of the income generated by the Endowment Fund shall be used for the Current Ministry expenses and benevolence. It is not intended to supplement the approved Current Ministry expense and benevolence.

Our Endowment Fund allows us to annually provide financial support to numerous nonprofits and organizations that do God's work. Peace is well known to our Mission Endowment Fund recipients and the community of Oshkosh. Since 1986, over \$1,000,000.00 has been given to support:

- Special Ministries and Missions in the ELCA, our Synod, and throughout the world.
- Charitable social services and educational agencies, along with shelters and institutions in our community.
- Scholarships for college and seminary students, and attendance at leadership conferences and church-related camping.
- Youth programs not part of our regular ministry.
- Expansion of new and existing ministries of Peace.

The Endowment Team, consists of five members, all of whom are voting members of Peace Lutheran Church and have been elected by the congregation at our annual meetings. They determine the annual distribution of the Peace Lutheran Church Endowment Fund based on the total fund value. Current members of the team are Barb Molash, Jean Anderson, Jessica Felker, Nancy Lokken, and Dave Nelson. The pastor and Leadership Team president are advisory members of the team.

When you have the opportunity, thank these individuals for the work they do guiding the activities of the Endowment Fund. Through their volunteer efforts, Peace is able to carry out our mission of discipleship and sharing Christ through service.

PEACE LUTHERAN CHURCH: THE NEEDS AND WANTS LIST

The Leadership Team maintains a Needs and Wants List that records large projects that need to be planned for budgetarily.

In the next year Peace will have costly scheduled maintenance to attend to with our elevator and our beautiful stained glass windows. As well, some cracked clay tiles have been identified on our gym roof which has led to leakage on the gym stage. To that end, next year we will have multiple large expenses for our building and grounds. As this fiscal year draws to a close, we would like our church family to know about these expenses in advance. A capital improvement fund is being set up as Peace begins to prepare for these repairs and maintenance. If you find that you have end of the year funds to allocate outside of your own household for tax-deductible purposes, we would like you to know of the option to help with these upcoming projects.

- Repair Gym Roof Leak (cost unknown)
- Replace Elevator Power Unit (\$35,000)
- Repair and Maintenance to the Two Large Stained Glass Windows in the Sanctuary (\$45,000 \$90,000)

Below are verses from November's Bible readings that made me stop and ask, "What is this telling me about my relationship with God and other people?" When time allows, re-visit the Sunday Bible readings. Look for verses that help answer that question for you.

Week of November 6, 2022

Job 19:25-27a 25For I know that my Redeemer lives, and that at the last he will stand upon the earth; 26and after my skin has been thus destroyed, then in my flesh I shall see God, 27awhom I shall see on my side, and my eyes shall behold, and not another."

I think I've got challenges in my life. Job lost his children, his wealth, and his health. In the face of ridicule from friends, he adamantly affirms his faith in God and his steadfast belief that God will be standing alongside him when he dies. Job demonstrates the kind of faith I pray daily for God to develop in me.

Week of November 13, 2022

Luke 21:9-12, 16-19 [Jesus said,] 9"When you hear of wars and insurrections, do not be terrified; for these things must take place first, but the end will not follow immediately." 10Then he said to them, "Nation will rise against nation, and kingdom against kingdom; 11there will be great earthquakes, and in various places famines and plagues; and there will be dreadful portents and great signs from heaven. 12"But before all this occurs, they will arrest you and persecute you; they will hand you over to synagogues and prisons, and you will be brought before kings and governors because of my name. 16You will be betrayed even by parents and brothers, by relatives and friends; and they will put some of you to death. 17You will be hated by all because of my name. 18But not a hair of your head will perish. 19By your endurance you will gain your souls."

Alright, this does not sound good. In fact, it's downright terrifying. Even the assurances Jesus provides don't make it easier to accept that Christians are in for a tough time as the end draws near...unless we realize that by remaining true to our faith we gain eternal life, even at the cost of our earthly lives.

Week of November 20, 2022

Psalm 46:1-3, 11 1God is our refuge and strength, a very present help in trouble. 2Therefore we will not fear, though the earth be moved, and though the mountains shake in the depths of the sea; 3though its waters rage and foam, and though the mountains tremble with its tumult. 11The Lord of hosts is with us; the God of Jacob is our stronghold.

In the face of natural disasters and human atrocities, God assures me over and over that He will always be with me. He is my strength, the one constant on which I can rely. That makes what is happening around me a lot easier to face and do something about.

Week of November 27, 2022

Matthew 24:44 [Jesus said to the disciples,] 44 "Therefore you also must be ready, for the Son of Man is coming at an unexpected hour."

Jesus reminds me that no one knows when he will return. So, I shouldn't spend my time worrying about what will happen some day. Instead, I need to put my trust in God and ask Him for the strength and courage to make the world a better place now.
