As we move into what is always a very busy time of the year, let's try not to get so caught up in all the commotion that we forget to express our appreciation for the things in our lives that matter most to us.

Week of November 26, 2023

Matthew 25:34-40 34Then the king will say to those at his right hand, 'Come, you that are blessed by my Father, inherit the kingdom prepared for you from the foundation of the world; 35for I was hungry and you gave me food, I was thirsty and you gave me something to drink, I was a stranger and you welcomed me, 36I was naked and you gave me clothing, I was sick and you took care of me, I was in prison and you visited me.' 37Then the righteous will answer him, 'Lord, when was it that we saw you hungry and gave you food, or thirsty and gave you something to drink? 38And when was it that we saw you a stranger and welcomed you, or naked and gave you clothing? 39And when was it that we saw you sick or in prison and visited you?' 40And the king will answer them, 'Truly I tell you, just as you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family you did it to me.'

I don't have to look far or long to find people in need of my help. When I'm tempted to look the other way or not acknowledge that I have the resources to provide that help, I ask God to give me the courage and strength to use the gifts He has given me to help those in need.

Trunk or Treat 2023 was a fun-filled event for our neighborhood.






ADULT EDUCATION
