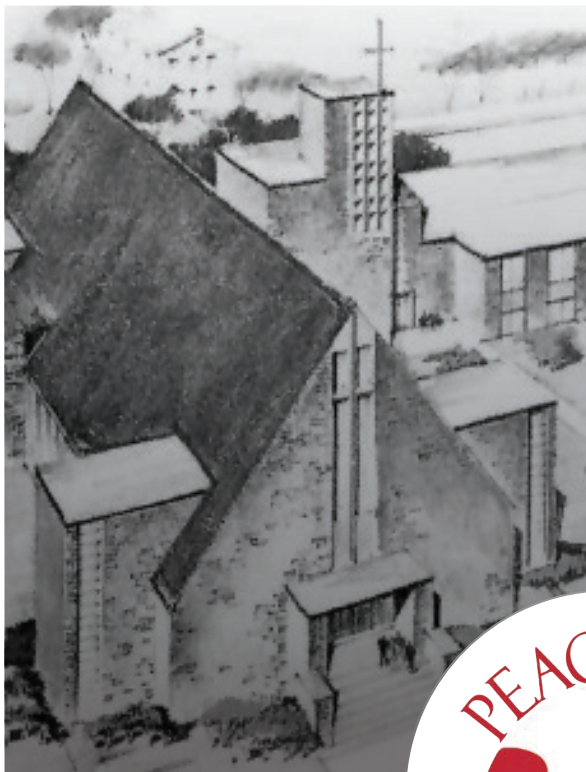

# FROM THE PASTOR

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As you may have heard in the 5th Sunday forum at the end of July, there's a playground coming to Peace's sanctuary soon! Here's a bit about what to expect:

## **What is a playground?**

A designated area in our worship space designed to enhance the worship experience for our youngest siblings in Christ. Sitting quietly and listening is one way to worship, but there are many ways throughout scripture that different people celebrated an encounter with God: Miriam sang and danced, Moses took off his shoes, and Jacob stacked rocks. A playground is a space for little ones to keep their hands busy while they soak in the worship happening all around them.



## **Why put in a playground?**

It helps us live into our value as being a congregation that welcomes, celebrates, and supports families with young children. We already do this by hosting several preschool programs in our building during the week. A playground will help us live this on Sunday mornings as well.

All the research on children's spiritual formation shows that kids and families who feel like they belong in the worship community from an early age, stick around. Putting in a designated space that is looked after and kept up by our church takes the burden off of the families to make sure they pack a bag that contains enough toys to keep the kids busy for an hour. It says to families "You are welcome here! We have a space for you!"

## **How does a playground work?**

It is a space for parents to sit for worship while their kids utilize the space nearby. We will start with one pew for parents and floor space for children. If the need for more parent seating grows, we will grow our space as well.

## **Where will the playground be located and what will it look like?**

We will be removing a few pews on the south side of the chapel and putting down some foam mats on the floor to designate a comfortable area for children to sit and move about on the floor. There will be a small shelf with bins full of soft toys and books that relate to the themes in our scripture texts.

## **Why the chapel area?**

Studies show that kids pay MORE attention the closer they are, and even when we think they might not be paying attention because they appear to us as if they are occupied with whatever toy they are playing with, they are in fact listening and observing. The chapel is close to the front so kids can see what's going on, but secluded enough that new or visiting families won't feel like they're on display. It's also close to an exit into the hallway if needed.

### **Will it be noisy?**

The sanctuary is already abounding in the noises of the children of our church, which is a sign of a vibrant church! The playground is not a noise level reduction solution, but a way to offer age-appropriate enrichment. Just like learning to ride a bike, hold a fork, or walk without falling over, learning how to be quiet in worship is a process that takes time. As grown ups, our job is to continue to model this ourselves, and be gracious to families in the midst of this learning period. That said, the toys in the playground will be soft and quiet. They will also be rotated out regularly as our worship themes change. The hope is that this space will help kids engage in worship quietly, but there will always be some noise when you have children in worship, because children are noisy creatures by nature. Personally, I will take a noisy church over an empty quiet one, any day.

### **Will we still keep the tables with coloring books and crayons in the back of the sanctuary?**

Yes. We feel that those tables meet the needs of older children and give families another option who may not feel ready to venture towards the front. The playground will be an addition which will focus on toddlers and preschoolers, though anyone is welcome.

**Note:** the playground is not a place for parents to drop off their children and go sit elsewhere. Parents are still responsible for their children and expected to worship together as a family. But we can all support families with young children by offering a warm smile, a wave, and words of welcome.

If you have more questions about the playground that have not been answered here, please reach out, and I will be happy to have a conversation or connect you with the other members of the playground team.

I am so grateful to be able to answer both my call to parenthood and my call to word and sacrament ministry at the same time. Thank you for making room for all of my callings and for the love and support you have given my young family in my time here.

## **FROM THE PRESIDENT**

---

Several Mission Teams have continued to gather, evaluate, and make recommendations to the Leadership Team regarding building related projects. Here's an update on projects that have been completed, continue to be evaluated, or will be implemented in the very near future.

### **PROPERTY MISSION TEAM**

#### **Rummage Sale Storage Room**

George Sawall added shelving in the room that is to the right of the stage. This room will be used to store items donated to Peace for our annual rummage sale.

#### **The Teacher's Closet (TTC)**

**TTC** has moved the last of their items from Peace to their new location. Their decision to leave Peace was based solely on the availability of a location that offered more storage than we could provide. Heidi Nelson painted the room they had been using (Room 100). George Sawall and Jesse Anderson upgraded the lighting in that room, and Graber Glass will be replacing a cracked window.

### **Oshkosh Area School District (OASD)**

Speaking of Room 100, Heather Miller worked with representatives from OASD to add Room 100 to their rental agreement with Peace. OASD welcomed the additional space, and we were able to replace the rent lost with TTC's move. A win-win for everyone!

### **Winnebago Land Barbershop Harmony Society (WBHS)**

After a very productive meeting with two representatives from WB, they agreed to move all their items from the small alcove under the stairs and store them, along with their other material, in the closets lining the north wall behind the green curtain in the Social Center. This area had previously been used for storage by TTC.

### **Catalpa Counselors (CC)**

CC will continue to use Room 205 for community counseling services. Another win-win for Peace and our community.

### **Elevator**

Fortunately, our elevator continues to meet code and operate safely. However, to ensure that we always have safe and adequate access to all three floors in our building, Dave Nelson is researching engineering costs related to remodeling the elevator room. Steve Berholtz is also looking into elevator alternatives.

### **Sidewalk Square Replacement**

The replacement of potentially hazardous sidewalk squares bordering our property is complete. We're now waiting for the bill from the City of Oshkosh.

### **Radon Testing**

The long-term (90 day) test results came back within acceptable limits. This means no action needs to be taken at this time. However, radon testing will have to be done every 5 years going forward.

### **Stained Glass Windows**

The fact that we don't have any unexpected costs related to radon in our building moves us a step closer to addressing the stained glass window repairs. Once the sidewalk repair costs are paid, planning for the stained glass project will become a priority.

### **PRAYGROUND PROJECT TEAM**

In recognition of the importance of fostering an inclusive, family-friendly environment within our congregation, Peace's Leadership Team approved the Prayground Team's recommendation to allocate resources from the Germain-Nelson Memorial Fund to create a "Prayground" space in our sanctuary. This space will be located on the south side of the Good Shepherd Chapel.

Creating a designated space within the sanctuary for children to pray, play, and engage with worship services can enhance their spiritual experience and promote their active participation. Our Prayground will serve as a welcoming and safe environment for families with young children, allowing parents to fully participate in worship while keeping their children engaged in age-appropriate activities. By integrating children into the worship experience from an early age, Peace can help develop strong faith foundations that will carry forward into their adult lives, contributing to the future vitality of our congregation. The Prayground concept aligns with Peace's values of inclusivity and embracing diversity. It demonstrates our commitment to providing for the needs of all members of our community, regardless of age.

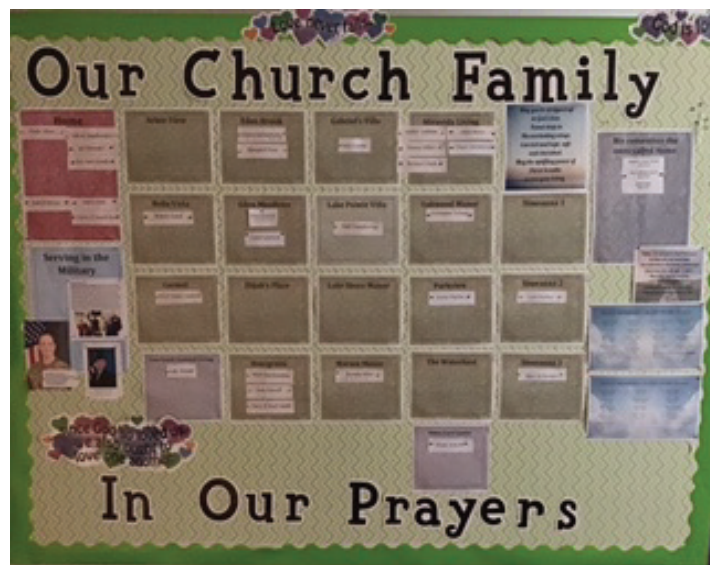

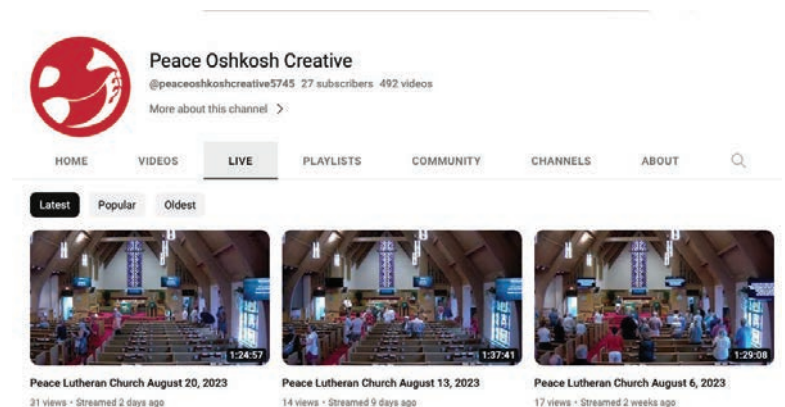
# TIMBER RATTLER OUTING

# REFLECTIONS ON GOD'S WORD

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The questions we start with guide the answers we uncover as we read the Bible. In my reflections during the last two years, I've started with the question, *"What is this telling me about my relationship with God and other people?"* In a recent sermon, Pastor Maggie posed the questions, *"What is God doing here, and how can I be part of it?"* Starting this month, I'm going to use those two questions to guide my reflections on verses from the weekly Bible readings. When time allows, re-visit the Sunday Bible readings. Look for verses that help answer those questions for you.

## Week of September 3, 2023

**Jeremiah 15:15** 15O Lord, you know; remember me and visit me, and bring down retribution for me on my persecutors. In your forbearance do not take me away; know that on your account I suffer insult.

*Right about now, I'd be stepping as far away from Jonah as I could in anticipation of God striking him dead with a bolt of lightning. But don't we all feel this way sometimes. We do everything God asks, but all we seem to get in return is disappointment and ridicule.*

**Jeremiah 15:19** 19Therefore thus says the Lord: If you turn back, I will take you back, and you shall stand before me. If you utter what is precious, and not what is worthless, you shall serve as my mouth. It is they who will turn to you, not you who will turn to them.

*Thank goodness God is patient. Instead of turning His back on us, He lets us know when we're wrong. If we stop feeling sorry for ourselves and continue to share the news of His love and forgiveness, He will be there with us. If we don't turn our backs on Him, He won't turn His back on us.*

## Week of September 10, 2023

**Romans 13:8** Owe no one anything, except to love one another; for the one who loves another has fulfilled the law.

*In 1 Corinthians 13:13, Paul writes, "So now faith, hope, and love abide, these three; but the greatest of these is love," Have you ever wondered why love is greater than faith and hope? It's because love fulfills both Old Testament law and New Testament grace. That's why we need to lead with love in our relations with others.*

## Week of September 17, 2023

**Matthew 18:21-35** 21Peter came and said to [Jesus], "Lord, if another member of the church sins against me, how often should I forgive? As many as seven times?" 22Jesus said to him, "Not seven times, but, I tell you, seventy-seven times.

*The first step in leading with love is to forgive those who we perceive have wronged us. If we forgive first, we can then practice "clean-slate Christianity." Just as God forgives us and lets us start each day with a "clean-slate," we, too, can forgive others and begin each new interaction with them free from bias or prejudice.*

## Week of September 24, 2023

**Jonah 3:10, 4:1-5** 10When God saw what [the people of Ninevah] did, how they turned from their evil ways, God changed his mind about the calamity that he had said he would bring upon them; and he did not do it. 4:1But this was very displeasing to Jonah, and he became angry. 2He prayed to the Lord and said, "O Lord! Is not this what I said while I was still in my own country? That is why I fled to Tarshish at the beginning; for I knew that you are a gracious God and merciful, slow to anger, and abounding in steadfast love, and ready to relent from punishing. 3And now, O Lord, please take my life from me, for it is better for me to die than to live." 4And the Lord said, "Is it right for you to be angry?" 5Then Jonah went out of the city and sat down east of the city, and made a booth for himself there. He sat under it in the shade, waiting to see what would become of the city.

*I see myself in Jonah. When God's actions don't match what I think He should do, I feel betrayed. I plop myself down and let God know how unjust He is. What I should be doing instead, is thinking beyond my own selfish desires and using His love for all people as a guide for my actions and to help develop a deeper understanding of Him.*
