THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR BRAD

Now there was a Pharisee named Nicodemus, a leader of the Jews. 2 He came to Jesus by night and said to him, "Rabbi, we know that you are a teacher who has come from God; for no one can do these signs that you do apart from the presence of God." John 3:1-2

Chances are you've heard of the game "Telephone". In case you are unfamiliar, it works like this: You have a group of people either standing in a circle or sitting in a straight line and a person on one end whispers a phrase into the next person's ear and it gets passed down the line. The key to this game is the phrase can only be said once so the person listening must listen carefully. One shot is all they get. Normally the end result is the person at the other end doesn't end up with the phrase that the first person shared. Somewhere along the way words get jumbled, assumptions are made and we end up with an inaccurate story. It's no one's fault really, but rather the work of the whole group. Sometimes there is one (or more) in the group who thinks it would be fun to mix up the phrase on purpose to see how absurd it might get or they want to make the last person say something off the wall. The truth is, while it may be funny in the moment, it isn't helpful in the long run.

I've experienced this kind of communication in various places but it seems to be quite common in the church. We have an issue with something and rather than addressing the person responsible for the situation directly we engage in this game of telephone in hopes that our request is met. Why is that? Are we so afraid of approaching someone directly that we look for any way to get out of it? What I've found when I hear things 2nd, 3rd or more removed from the actual request I have more questions than the person sharing the information with me has answers. Do you see the problem here? I've got questions that need answers and so now I've got to go to the person who had the question/concern in the first place to get the answers I need. Even if I don't have

any questions I still have to explain my answer to this person and then they have to go back to the original person who may or may not like the answer I've given. Is it only me or does that sound exhausting? Wouldn't it be much simpler to ask the person directly the question you have? Then there is no need to go back and forth between people and you will probably get your answer quicker anyway!

Nicodemus wanted to talk to Jesus, to help straighten him out from what he thought was sketchy teaching. Nicodemus also didn't want to approach Jesus when others could see him so he went at night. What Nicodemus learned was that he didn't know everything he thought he did because he also had bad information.

When the two talked together they understood each other better.

I encourage you to ask people direct questions, find out why something is or isn't being done from the person making the decisions. This applies not only in church but in our world. How much simpler would life be if we talked to one another rather than send our messages down the telephone line in hopes that the message at the end is the same as the beginning.

We are all community together. Through the good, the bad, the happy, the sad, the hurt the joy - no matter what we are in this together because we have all been claimed by God as God's children. To me, that's as good a reason as any to work together despite what differences we might think we have.





WATERFEST RECAP

Torrential rains on **June 27th** did not hinder the success of the fundraising opportunity at the summer Waterfest Concert Series for Peace Lutheran Church. Over 30 dedicated volunteers from Peace Lutheran Church showed up at the specified 4:45PM report time just as the rain and high winds were making a great display of their power. Gate opening times were delayed until 7PM, but this gave volunteers an opportunity to mingle and get themselves well oriented.

By 6:30, the storm had run its course, workers went out and cleaned up the Leach Amphitheater grounds, and the PLC volunteers took their posts.

The evening was a success. The volunteers worked hard checking concert attendees into the park grounds, delicious food was vended, and a large amount of beverages were sold. Peace Lutheran Church took in slightly over \$1100 in cash tips that evening. An additional donation from the Waterfest organization will be coming to Peace Lutheran Church in the near future which will reflect a small percentage of the income from that evening. The funds from this fundraiser have not been fully designated yet, however, a good portion of the funds will go towards some necessary updates that the Property Team will have to invest in over the next few years.

PARK DANCE RECAP



July 12th was the 11th Annual Park Dance and marked the 6th year that Peace Lutheran Church sold concessions for the event. For those who are not familiar with the event and the

fundraising opportunity for Peace Christian Preschool, the Park Dance is an annual event sponsored by Player's Pizza and Pub. The owners of Player's Pizza and Pub remembered the Friday night dances that took place in South Park in the 60's and wanted a way to bring back the fun. As a past, long-time employee of Players Pizza, and also because the manager of Players Pizza believes strongly in the importance of a strong early learning experience, Carla Nigl reached out to Heather Miller so that Peace Christian Preschool could be the recipient of the fundraising opportunity. Over the past 6 years, Peace Christian Preschool staff and board members along with Peace Lutheran Church members have served food and beverages at the event. The funds raised on the evening of the event go towards many onsite updates benefiting the preschool and Peace Lutheran Church. In the past, funds have been invested into Peace in areas that the preschool utilizes. For example, funds have gone to replace sanctuary lighting, to clean up the landscaping on 8th Avenue, to help with the cost of new blacktop in the parking lot, and to purchase a large garbage bin for hauling daily garbage out to the dumpster.



This year's Park Dance broke records for attendance and funds raised. It was an absolutely exhausting event, but well worth all of the time and energy invested.

A few items that will be updated with this year's funds include: replacing the old metal kitchen trolleys, replacing the heavy old banquet tables, and setting aside funds for better lawn maintenance on the 8th Avenue side of Peace Lutheran Church.



HEALING GARDEN

Exciting advancements have been made with the Peace Healing Garden. Have you ventured over to the area near the playground fence line to see the progress? Toward the end of June, the Miller family worked with George Sawall to complete the excavation of the pergola pad and the winding path leading to the pad. The Nelson family, recently returned from their tropical vacation, used their large truck to bring in three loads of crushed red granite. This finished the pergola swing pad and the path.

Shortly thereafter, George began the assembly of the pergola swing, George and Travis Miller were able to finish the final assembly to the pergola on July 2nd.

The next step is to start planting perennial plants and flowers in the garden area. The goal is to plant a variety of Hostas around the bases of the two trees in the garden and to add colorful flowers along the garden path. Ideally we'll get some flowers established this year, and be able to bring in hostas next spring from personal gardens. There will be some signage added as well. We hope that you will be able to take a minute and enjoy a relaxing, "Healing" break in this area.




