THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR BRAD

God can do anything, you know—far more than you could ever imagine or guess or request in your wildest dreams! God does it not by pushing us around but by working within us, his Spirit deeply and gently within us.
- Ephesians 3:20-21a, The Message translation

Time is a funny thing. There are moments that seem to last forever and moments that quickly pass by. For many of us, it feels like forever since March 2020 And, yet, somehow we are looking at August 2021. Our world has changed. There is no denying it. Now we could have a lively conversation about why and how, but it still comes down to our world has changed.

Through the month of July and into August, we have been focusing on Paul's letter to the Ephesians in worship. We have been looking at how our expectations need to change, because what God has given us through Christ's death on the cross changes us. No longer should we look at one another and see differences, but rather we should see what unites us. It's a good idea, at least in theory, that we are united together through Christ. While we all might feel differently about change, one thing hopefully we all can agree on is that the change we find in ourselves through Christ's death on the cross is positive. We are freed to be who God has created us to be and, with that knowledge, hopefully we also see a change in ourselves and in the world around us.

We are all a part of the family, all welcomed equally by God and then challenged to do the same for others. As we move forward into the fall, my hope is that we understand we do so together. That doesn't mean we always agree; in fact it's almost a guarantee that we won't. Which is ok because We are different people who are united through Christ. As long as we don't lose sight of that, it will be OK.

How will you make a place at the table for others in the days ahead? What might that look like for you? How can you best live into the idea that God has put good work in front of you and now it's time to live that out?

I look forward to sharing that space with you.



This year some of the fun things we are planning include game nights, retreats, ski/snowboarding trips, sledding, movies, dinners, bowling and so much more!



PROPERTY TEAM: 2021 PROJECTS AND THEIR UPDATES

Current Members of the Property Team:

Jesse Andersen (Team Chair), Jean Andersen, George Sawall (Building & Grounds Maintenance Staff), Andy Janke, Dave Nelson, Heather Miller (Congregational Life Staff), Amy Lee (Leadership Team Liaison) and Kathi Sawall (Garden Team Lead)

The Property Team works continually to pinpoint the property needs of the church building and grounds. Aside from routine work, the team has pulled forward projects that will be worked on this year.

Updates on this year's projects:

Completed

- Install a window/door on the bell tower landing for easier access to the Parish Center roof.
- Add a molding at the top of the panels behind the chancel choir to hide audio-video cords and cables.
- Paint the sanctuary an appealing neutral color consistent with the rest of the building.

In-Progress

- Replace the hallway flooring on the upper level as it has become worn out and dated.
- Update lighting throughout the building to more energy and cost efficient fixtures.
- Tree maintenance--remove the Ash tree that has sustained damage.
- Parking Lot--Sealcoat and stripe the parking lot.
- Relocate the dumpsters to allow the parsonage property to be parcelled off.
UPDATE: THANK YOU to our members who have donated enough funds for this project. A date is being scheduled for this project to be completed in August!
- Repair, replace or update the kitchen's grease trap (decision pending professional advice). The grease trap is a required element of food service kitchens which collects FOG--fat, oil and grease, and prevents it from entering the pipes that lead to the sewer. Currently, the PLC grease trap does not function.
UPDATE: A professional plumber has been contracted and the project is slated to be complete in late August. Any additional funding for this project would still be appreciated.

Some tomatoes are getting ready to be harvested. Keep your eyes open when you visit and help yourself to the vegetables when they are ready!


What are they doing next?

DRIVE-UP COMMUNION

As we transition to the summer months and more people are returning to worship in person, we are going to start offering drive-up communion once a month to go along with our campfire worship services.

REFLECTIONS ON GOD'S WORD

I often forget the Bible readings shortly after a church service...unless I take time during the week to revisit those readings. Fortunately, the Wednesday and Sunday services are available for review online. When I re-listen to the Bible readings I always find additional insight into how I should be living my life.

Below are verses from August's Bible readings that made me stop and think. If time allows, take a few moments to re-listen to each week's Bible readings. When you find a verse that causes you to pause, ask yourself, "What could this look like in my life?"

Week of August 1, 2021

Ephesians 4:11 & 12 ¹¹The gifts he gave were that some would be apostles, some prophets, some evangelists, some pastors and teachers, ¹²to equip the saints for the work of ministry, for building up the body of Christ.

God has given everyone gifts. I need to use my gifts to serve God and people. My challenge is to discover what my gifts are and then uncover them so that others come to know Jesus through my use of those gifts.

Week of August 8, 2021

1 Kings 19:4-6 ⁴Elijah went a day's journey into the wilderness, and came and sat down under a solitary broom tree. He asked that he might die: "It is enough; now, O Lord, take away my life, for I am no better than my ancestors." ⁵Then he lay down under the broom tree and fell asleep. Suddenly an angel touched him and said to him, "Get up and eat." ⁶He looked, and there at his head was a cake baked on hot stones and a jar of water. He ate and drank, and lay down again.

There are times when life can be overwhelming, and the thought of curling up in a corner and letting the world go by, sounds very appealing. I need to remember that God is always with me, providing the support I need to continue the mission he has laid out for me.

Week of August 15, 2021

Ephesians 5:15-17 ¹⁵Be careful then how you live, not as unwise people but as wise, ¹⁶making the most of the time, because the days are evil. ¹⁷So do not be foolish, but understand what the will of the Lord is.

No question, my time on earth is limited. But what I do with that time is limitless. I need to make the most of my time by using the gifts God has given me to build up His church on earth.

Week of August 22, 2021

Joshua 24:15 ¹⁵...but as for me and my household, we will serve the Lord."

Week of August 29, 2021

To transition to making many financial investments into our program all at one time and under a deadline, has been very mind altering. And therefore, a bit stressful at times.


