THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR BRAD

This is an excerpt from Pastor Brad's 2018 Pastor's Report that was presented at the Annual Meeting.

Ecclesiastes 3:1-11

1For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: ***2*** a time to be born, and a time to die; a time to plant, and a time to pluck up what is planted; ***3*** a time to kill, and a time to heal; a time to break down, and a time to build up; ***4*** a time to weep, and a time to laugh; a time to mourn, and a time to dance; ***5*** a time to throw away stones, and a time to gather stones together; a time to embrace, and a time to refrain from embracing; ***6*** a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to throw away; ***7*** a time to tear, and a time to sew; a time to keep silence, and a time to speak; ***8*** a time to love, and a time to hate; a time for war, and a time for peace. ***9*** What gain have the workers from their toil? ***10*** I have seen the business that God has given to everyone to be busy with. ***11*** He has made everything suitable for its time; moreover he has put a sense of past and future into their minds, yet they cannot find out what God has done from the beginning to the end.

These words from Ecclesiastes are familiar to many of us in a different form; we recognize them from a song written by Pete Seeger and then made famous by the folk-rock group "The Byrds". It became popular in the mid 1960's, and it resonated with many as a call for understanding and harmony in the midst of turmoil, namely the Vietnam War.

These words resonate with me as I reflect back on 2018 at Peace. They serve as a reminder that the more we wish things could stay the same the more they seem to change. They also serve as a reminder for those who long for change that sometimes that happens a lot slower or in ways other than we first imagined or hoped that it would. I think both of these sentiments have been felt by the members of Peace throughout this past

year and no doubt will be felt again as we move into 2019.

If I could use one word to sum up 2018 at Peace it would be "transition". We've experienced many transitions at Peace this past year. Some of them quite big and some of them very subtle. We've had deaths and baptisms, we've had disagreements and celebrations, we've had new ideas that have gone well and new ideas that didn't work out. We've had staff who have gone on to new adventures and staff who have come on board to continue the work in front of us, we've had volunteers who've stepped down and new volunteers step up. We've gotten to know each other better as pastor and people and learned how to work together better. We've not always done it perfectly but we have moved forward and hopefully learned lessons along the way.

Through it all, we have continued to be the community that is called Peace Lutheran Church and we've continued to do the best we can to live out our mission statement as we are "Called to make disciples. Sent to share Christ".

I am thankful for my call to serve among God's people at Peace and thankful that I've been able to share God's love for God's people with you. I know there are areas that I've struggled, areas that I could do better and areas that I've been successful at. I know that the Holy Spirit has led me to this place and is constantly revealing to me new ideas and possibilities to share with you. I look forward to those things in 2019 and beyond. Thank you for being an integral part of the ministry at Peace Lutheran Church.

Hospitality Services for Funerals Hosted at Peace Lutheran Church

What am I talking about?	Expanding our current hospitality services beyond Sunday mornings to include hosting coffee (and possibly desserts) at funeral services hosted at Peace Lutheran Church
Who am I asking to do this?	I would like to start with two specific teams from our church, the Hospitality Hosts and the Care of Congregation Team. This is not going to be an elite group which means anyone who would like to supply me with their name and contact information can be added to the group and would be graciously welcomed to help.
Why do I want to do this?	To offer this comforting show of support to a family who is grieving the loss of a loved one. If we provide the coffee and the desserts for the family and their guests, then they are able to better engage in what they are really at the church for that day.
What would it look like?	I would propose two different teams to serve on the day of a funeral service: One team to host coffee before the service and a second team to host coffee after the service--if the funeral party is staying for a meal. Prior to the funeral a beverage station would be set up in the upstairs kitchenette similar to what Sunday morning hospitality looks like--coffee and perhaps cookies. The intended recipient would be family members who are in attendance for the pre-funeral service activities. After the funeral service it would mean having 3 or 4 carafes of coffee in the Social Center for those who host a meal on site. Possibly providing desserts for a catered meal.
What is the next step?	I will begin a process of collecting names from our list of Care of Congregation team members and our Hospitality Hosts to find out who would be interested in helping to either be present to serve coffee and who would be willing to provide cookies or coffee cakes to be served. I will also welcome additional names of anyone who may be interested in helping with the funeral hospitality service.



FIRST COMMUNION CLASS



First Communion



PEACE CHRISTIAN PRESCHOOL

Greetings Families and Friends of
Peace Christian Preschool,

We made it through the exhausting return to school routines that happens when we all have a two week hiatus for the holidays. The January transition back to routines is a little bit more work for teachers, parents and the children, but we wouldn't skip the break. Along with the transition back to school routines, we have finally gone through our Young Star technical rating, a process that began in mid-August. And on the fun side we are preparing for fun Valentine's Day celebrations.

In my January newsletter I promised an update on the Meat Raffle Experience that we hosted as "first-timers" at Player's Pizza and Pub in December. It was fun and productive! As a newbie to meat raffles, my husband and I did some reconnaissance at a local pub. We took away some ideas from the raffle we visited and put them into effect at ours. The event was well attended by regular patrons of Players and supporters of the preschool. As I am not quick-witted or comfortable speaking on a microphone, I recruited my husband, who has never shied away from being the center of attention, to be the announcer for the evening. On the business end of things, we earned \$350 for the preschool that evening. \$100 of which came from the meat raffle itself (tickets to win were only \$.50 but I have learned I need to charge \$1 next time) and the other \$250 came from the 50/50 raffle. We have been invited back to host the meat raffle again, and this time I'm feeling more confident about the entire event.

Participating in the Young Star technical evaluation was a voluntary decision that we made

last spring but since we operate only during the school year we had to wait for August to arrive before we began the consultation and evaluation process. Young Star is Wisconsin's quality rating and improvement program for early learning centers. Once we began the process, we were allotted 10 hours within five months to work with a state consultant. A lot of the practices that the consultants want to see, we already implemented but we had to formalize our policies and procedures to reflect our standards. We will continue to be annually rated, and we will continue to make improvements. While there is a good amount of work involved in proving we do great things here, it is worth the work.

February brings the second occasion for which the preschoolers send out holiday cards to both older members of Peace Lutheran Church and to their own select family members. We have made the work on our end easier and more cost effective by moving from greeting cards to homemade postcards. Six years into the project and we're working smarter!

Share the word, we are actively taking applications for the next school year. If you have a child or know of a child who will be 3-years-old by the next school year, please consider sending them to Peace Christian Preschool. Applications will be accepted from January first until all of the spots are filled. We have the most exceptional staff who provide an amazing experience!


