THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR BRAD

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. ² He was in the beginning with God. ³ All things came into being through him, and without him not one thing came into being. What has come into being ⁴ in him was life, [a] and the life was the light of all people. ⁵ The light shines in the darkness, and the darkness did not overcome it.

¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him.

¹¹ He came to what was his own, [c] and his own people did not accept him. ¹² But to all who received him, who believed in his name, he gave power to become children of God, ¹³ who were born, not of blood or of the will of the flesh or of the will of man, but of God. ¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, [d] full of grace and truth.

- John 1:1-5, 10-14

Happy 2021! I am guessing many of you are happy at that last sentence because, for most of us, 2020 wasn't necessarily the happiest of years. I, for one, could never have imagined that when I dismissed the second service on March 8 that we would be dismissing worship as we knew it for the foreseeable future. Even though we've come back together in person for worship, our service is only partially what we've come to know. We don't sing, our musicians and our readers are projected on TV screens, we take communion not by coming to the rail but from our pew, from pre-packaged cups. For those not in church we offer drive-thru communion like our favorite fast food restaurant. I would never have guessed that I would become so aware of how to navigate social media as a way of sharing our worship together, I never would have dreamed that we would worship together for Christmas from the comfort of our homes rather than in person. Yet, that was 2020. Who could have imagined?

YET

God was and is still present. The Holy Spirit is stirring in ways that we never imagined might be possible. We never stopped being the church, never stopped being able to worship together, only

the way we did it changed and still continues to change.

That's what I love about this reading from John, words we typically hear this time of year as we talk about the birth of the Christ child.

¹⁰ He was in the world, and the world came into being through him; yet the world did not know him.

¹⁴ And the Word became flesh and lived among us, and we have seen his glory, the glory as of a father's only son, full of grace and truth.

Jesus has always been with us and will continue to be with us as we move forward in 2021. That is never going to change and has never changed. Jesus is present in our relationships, he is present when we come to the table (whatever that might look like), he is present when the world seems upside down and inside out. Now more than ever we need to lean into our faith that God is with us, we need to lean into those lessons we learned in the season of Advent that even in the most unlikely of situations God will continue to show up because that is what God does.

Life is going to continue to look a bit different for awhile and none of us know for certain when or even if this is going to change and that's ok. We don't need to know, even if every ounce of being says otherwise. The important thing for us to remember is that God is present and because God is present, anything is possible.

On a personal note, I want to thank everyone who remembered Steph and I over the Advent and Christmas season. We are blessed to be a part of the Peace family and your love for us is humbling. We are fortunate to be able to serve God in this way and we are thankful that you are a part of our journey. I look forward to what 2021 has to offer for all of us.

I hope that you know you are loved by God and by me.




(NOT YOUR PARENTS') PENNY WAR

In the December newsletter I noted that we had the help of a church member who connected our group to the Thrivent Cares Grant and we were able to expand our recipient list for the Holiday Sunshine Bags. While our original intention was to bring a bit of sunshine to our shut-in members and those who are staying safe-at-home, due to receiving additional funding we were able to expand our reach beyond those members. We added a few people we knew would appreciate a surprise.

We still have no perfect plan to distribute the bags. If you know of someone who would be touched with a sunshine bag, please share their name.

One very exciting addition was to deliver a set of Holiday Sunshine Bags to members of our Church Family who are currently in college. In a normal year, the wrap up of a semester can be stressful; the end of a semester during COVID-19 must certainly be more stressful!

- Stop in the office and purchase scrip cards we have on hand.
- Shop with a volunteer located in the Narthex before or after most services.

How do I pay?

You can set up a PrestoPay account in your [shopwithscrip](http://shopwithscrip.com) account and pay online with a \$0.15 transaction fee, or you can pay by cash or check made out to "Peace Lutheran Church." All payments must be received by noon on every other Monday to be included in the order. Orders are placed every other week and delivered to church by Friday on the week of the order.

How do I get my order?

All physical cards are picked up from a volunteer located in the narthex before or after most services OR available in the office. On-hand orders are ready for immediate pick-up.
