# THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR BRAD

***4 Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud.—1st Corinthians 13:4 (NRSV)***

Beloved Siblings in Christ,

Chances are you've heard this verse, along with the rest of chapter 13, at a wedding or have heard it described as the "love" chapter. I must admit, these words are something we should strive for in our life together, words that remind us that love is supposed to build each other up rather than tear us apart.

What I wonder is if anyone really knows the story behind Paul's writing of the "love chapter" in his letter to the Corinthians. You see, the people of Corinth didn't get along - at all - and often they would disagree simply to start an argument and quickly forget what they are arguing about. Does that sound familiar to our life in 2020? I honestly think at times we've forgotten how to disagree with each other while still showing love for one another. Don't get me wrong, loving one another is hard work especially when we don't agree with them or feel like they don't appreciate who we are. That's why the idea of love being patient and kind is important; they counter the other actions like envy, anger, fear and pride while reminding us to care for each other.

It's no coincidence that Jesus talks about love more than anything else in the Gospels. He talks about God's love for God's people and how we are to love one another as God has loved us. He talks about caring for the least of these through loving acts like feeding the hungry, welcoming the outcast, comforting the weary, caring for the sick, and empowering the marginalized. Jesus said, "as you do for the least of these you do for me." The love we show to others then reflects the love we have for God. It's impossible to love God if you don't love others as well.

Friends, I know that all of us are tired, weary, confused and we wonder how we can continue forward. I get it. Trust me, I truly get it. I'm right there with you. Others do too. This might be a difficult time but we are surrounded by others who can help us get through these times, we are surrounded by those who can remind us what it truly means to love one another.


I'm thankful for you my friends. I'm thankful for the work we've done together and the work we will continue to do.


To try and lessen the loss, here is a fun activity that we can do together while apart! It is an outdoor Bible verse scavenger hunt.

## **GARDEN TEAM UPDATE:**

The Garden Team continues to meet once a week under the thoughtful leadership of Kathi Sawall. Kathi heads up communication for work to be done for the flower beds, the Healing Garden and the vegetable gardens. And she diligently keeps her team motivated. In June we seeded a few areas for new grass and have attempted to grow grass during these hot days. We recognize we'll have a lot of drought-resistant weeds to fight and more seed to replant when the temperatures cool again in the fall, but we're excited with our prospective start.

We planted some low maintenance Lamb's Ear near the 9th Avenue gym entrance and mulched with cocoa bean shells. Solar lights were added for some evening appeal. We are hoping to add some rubber edging to the area to define the divide between landscape and lawn.

The Peace Garden has Rhubarb available now. Our beans, tomatoes, cucumbers, and squash are growing nicely and will be available later this summer.

The team is excited about the addition of a young high school volunteer, Jack Kесе, who will work independently to keep the landscape bushes on 8th Avenue groomed and maintained. This is a greatly appreciated contribution of time and energy that compliments the work of the garden team. Thank you Jack!



All has gone well and we are happy to help our community in this capacity.





## **PEACE LUTHERAN HAS MANY TEAMS. WE WILL LIST A FEW EACH MONTH, STARTING WITH THE FOLLOWING:**

### **LEADERSHIP TEAM:**

The Leadership Team consists of 9 members, who all have been elected by the congregation at the yearly annual meeting. The length of a term is 2 years. Each member, if they so choose, may serve a total of 3 consecutive 2-year terms.

The Leadership Team oversees the happenings of the church. Various teams throughout the church report to the Leadership Team as well. The team meets every third Tuesday of the month. All Leadership member's names and phone numbers are listed weekly in the bulletin and monthly in the newsletter. We encourage you to contact any one of them with questions that you may have.

### **WORSHIP TEAM:**

The main goal of this committee is to provide a meaningful, inspirational worship experience for the congregation and guests as they gather together to worship their Lord and Savior.

At Peace, we offer on Sunday a traditional service (8:00 a.m.), a praise service (10:30 a.m.), and on Wednesday evening (5:30 p.m.) a warm, friendly, casual service. With these three services we try to meet the different worship expectations of all those who attend.

Peace offers a variety of special services, coordinated by the Worship Team—a Jazz Service, Blue Christmas Service, Lenten Services, a Polka Service, and other special services. Several different liturgies are introduced and used throughout the year.

Another goal of the team is to offer a beautiful, warm, friendly place to worship. All should feel welcomed. This goal is achieved through the efforts of the members and the following committees: ushers,

hospitality, lectors, communion assistants, altar guild, decoration, worship technicians, and music staff.

Music plays an important part in our services—the choirs, instrumentalists, and organist—all help to enhance the worship experience. Your suggestions and concerns are discussed at the Worship Team Meetings. If you wish to attend a meeting, please do so. All are welcome!

### **CARE OF CONGREGATION:**

The goal of the Care of the Congregation Team is to make members of Peace Lutheran Church feel cared for and appreciated. We focus on showing our many volunteers how much we appreciate them. This might include a thank you note for their hard work, or a small gift of gratitude. We also honor our veterans.

Throughout the year, we send greetings to our members who are homebound or residing in nursing homes and birthday cards to members 80 and over. We also orchestrate delivery of poinsettias to those members every December to brighten the Christmas season. The Care of the Congregation Team also leads the Prayer Shawl Ministry and the Meals that Heal volunteers.

Meetings are held in the library at 5:00 p.m. every 2nd Thursday of the month. Please feel free to join us!

### **HOSPITALITY TEAM:**

The Hospitality Team provides refreshments between the Sunday morning services. This provides time for socialization between the members who attend the early traditional service and the later contemporary service. Coffee, tea and juice is offered, as well as many homemade goodies provided by the team members.



## How do I pay?

You can set up a PrestoPay account in your [shopwithscrip](http://shopwithscrip.com) account and pay online with a \$0.15 transaction fee, or you can pay by cash or check made out to "Peace Lutheran Church." All payments must be received by noon on every other Monday to be included in the order. Orders are placed every other week and delivered to church by Friday on the week of the order.

All physical cards are picked up from a volunteer located in the narthex before or after most services OR available in the office. On-hand orders are ready for immediate pick-up.


