DRIVE-UP COMMUNION



As we transition to the summer months and more people are returning to worship in person, we are going to start offering drive-

up communion once a month to go along with our campfire worship services.

We will offer drive-up communion for anyone who would like it on the **third Wednesday of the month in June, July and August from 5:30 to 6:15**. Those who are attending the campfire worship would be able to receive communion at that service if they desire.

When fall returns we will again evaluate what might be best in regards to drive-up communion.

OTHER COMMUNION OPTIONS

In addition to drive-up communion, we offer weekly communion over **Zoom on Wednesday nights at 6:00** (except when we offer drive-up communion) and for those who are comfortable we are beginning to offer home communion as well. REFLECTIONS ON GOD'S WORD

I often forget the Bible readings shortly after a church service...unless I take a couple minutes during the week to revisit those readings. Fortunately, the Wednesday and Sunday services are available online to review. When I do listen to the Bible readings again, I find there's a lot to learn about how I should be living my life. Below are verses from June's Bible readings that made me stop and think.



If time allows, take a few moments to review each week's Bible passages. When you find a verse that causes you to pause, ask yourself, "What does this mean in my life?"

Week of June 6, 2021

Psalm 130:3-4 ³If you were to keep watch over sins, O Lord, who could stand? ⁴Yet with you is forgiveness, in order that you may be feared.

Those who believe that God is their father have always known that without his forgiveness they could not face Him. That understanding is a powerful reminder that regardless of how good or righteous I think I am, without God's forgiveness I, too, would not be able to face Him.

Week of June 13, 2021

Psalm 92:4 ⁴For you have made me glad by your acts, O Lord; and I shout for joy because of the works of your hands.

I have joy in my life because God sacrificed his only son so that my sins could be forgiven and eternal life is available to me. I need to share that joy with others!

Week of June 20, 2021

Psalm 107:1 ¹Give thanks to the Lord, for the Lord is good, for God's mercy endures forever.

Regardless of how often I stumble, or how far I fall, as long as I find my way back to God, and ask His forgiveness, He will take me back...because His mercy endures forever. Who else does that!?!'

Week of June 27, 2021

Mark 5:33-34 ³³But the woman, knowing what had happened to her, came in fear and trembling, fell down before Jesus, and told him the whole truth.

I know exactly how this woman felt. It's not easy admitting to God that I've let him down. In fact, it's downright scary, and I avoid doing it.

³⁴He said to her, "Daughter, your faith has made you well; go in peace, and be healed of your disease."

But I don't have to be afraid. God knows I'm imperfect. And I know that my faith in God, His mercy and forgiveness, makes asking for forgiveness possible...which lets me live a joyful life!


