

# THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR BRAD

*Rejoice in hope, be patient in suffering, persevere in prayer. - Romans 12:12 (NRSV)*

Beloved Siblings in Christ,

Sixty days ago many of us gathered in the sanctuary at Peace Lutheran for worship, not knowing fully what lay ahead of us. We knew that something called Covid-19 was impacting not only our country but also the world. We knew that it was being taken quite seriously and that we needed to follow suit. Since that time, everything as we know it has changed, often daily. We are all learning as we go, figuring out how to be church in ways that we never would have imagined. Sixty days later, we are still working on how to do it. I do know this much - God has been with us every step of the way and will continue to be with us each step of the way.

I want you to know that your leadership team has been working diligently on what it will look like when we come together to worship in person, the precautions that will need to be taken and what the best practices will be. For now, we have determined the best practices are to continue worshipping online like we've been doing. We recognize it isn't the ideal option for everyone but for now it's the best we can do. I'm proud of the work they've done and I'm thankful that I get to work with them in the midst of this. As more information becomes available about a possible date to begin in-person services we will make sure to share that with you.

On May 31st we celebrate the day of Pentecost, the birthday of the church. The idea behind Pentecost is to acknowledge that the Holy Spirit is now present and among the people, guiding them as they move the Church forward. Which makes sense since we the people make up the church and we are the church whenever and however we are gathered. A church isn't a building but rather it is the people. We've been the

church throughout the past 60 days; we simply haven't been in one building together. In many ways, we've actually been more active as the church as we've been physically apart because we've found different ways, new ways, forgotten ways to be the church together. Throughout this newsletter you will find ways that we've been the church together since March 15th and you will see how we hope to continue to be the church together as we move forward in the weeks, months and years ahead.

Perhaps one of the silver linings to come from this pandemic is the opportunities we've had to hit the pause button and reflect on how we approached life and how we can approach it differently. I know that I have learned life lessons that I will carry with me long after we are told we can begin to resume life in a way that seems normal. I'm sure you've learned life lessons as well. Maybe it's not to take things for granted or maybe that we don't need to be as on the go as we think we do. Perhaps you've reconnected with friends and family you haven't talked to in a while or you've learned a new hobby or read that book you always meant to read.

Whatever it is, please know this—God is in the midst of it and for that we are thankful.

I cannot wait until we are able to be together again, whatever that might look like. Until then, continue to find God at work in the most unlikely of places. Do your part to move God's kingdom forward. Care for each other as you have been cared for.

Wash your hands. Say your prayers. Know that God loves you and so do I.





## ***THE AMAZING BELL OF PEACE LUTHERAN CHURCH:***

When the doors to the church had to be closed after our service on March 15th, the Leadership Team wanted the congregation to know that our church was here to serve in whatever capacity we could serve our church family and our neighborhood. We started a noon bell-ringing schedule.

Each day since the doors were closed a group of staff and leadership team volunteers have been ringing the noon bell.



## **THE AMAZING BELL OF PEACE LUTHERAN CHURCH:**

*Many people are not familiar with the history of the Peace Lutheran Church bell.*

From a church celebration book published in 1960 to commemorate the 100th anniversary of Peace Lutheran Church, this is the information about our bell:


*In the spring of 1883, the congregation determinedly resolved to rebuild the faulty church tower. From the new tower, a 2,000 pound bell, a gift of the Young Ladies Society in 1883, was to resound for many years. The bell still rings the call to worship to this day.*

Having read about this 2000 pound bell, my youngest son, Cameron and I, decided we needed to see it for ourselves. We opened the trapdoor to the belfry, climbed the iron wall-hung ladder and were very impressed with what we found!

This bell was casted in the Buckeye Foundry of Cincinnati, Ohio. You may be aware that another Buckeye Foundry bell which is only a few years older than this one, and less than half of the size of Peace's bell, was recently put on display outside of the Ceape Avenue Fire House. I would not recommend climbing the church's belfry, but you can walk up to the bell on display at the Ceape Avenue Fire House—check it out!

## **THE LITTLE FREE PANTRY:**

The Little Free Pantry has been a very important vessel in our community from the first day that it was introduced. Now, more than ever before, our free pantry has become an extremely busy mission of Peace Lutheran Church. Using funds allocated to them from the Peace Lutheran Endowment Fund, members of the Mission and Outreach team have worked tirelessly to do their best to keep the pantry stocked. Each day, the bell ringers have checked the pantry and restocked from the church's indoor pantry shelves.

Additionally, members of the congregation have continued with their own contributions to the Pantry. And it is not a rarity to see random members of the community stopping by to drop off a few extra items. Many thanks to our Little Free Pantry for being a 24-hour, 7-day per week mission to our community!



## **CARE OF CONGREGATION:**

Back in February the Care of Congregation had a year-long goal of sending one 'Thinking of You' card to every member of the Peace Lutheran Church congregation. 


## THE GARDEN GROUP

You are now ready to shop!

- Turn in a scrips order form to the box located just outside of the church office.
- Stop in the office and purchase scrip cards we have on hand.
- Shop with a volunteer located in the Narthex before or after most services.

If you shop online, check out PrestoPay™, Reload, and ScripNow®. All make scrip shopping even more convenient!

## How do I pay?

You can set up a PrestoPay account in your [shopwithscrip](http://shopwithscrip.com) account and pay online with a \$0.15 transaction fee, or you can pay by cash or check made out to "Peace Lutheran Church." All payments must be received by noon on every other Monday to be included in the order. Orders are placed every other week and delivered to church by Friday on the week of the order.

## How do I get my order?

All physical cards are picked up from a volunteer located in the narthex before or after most services OR available in the office. On-hand orders are ready for immediate pick-up.

*Example Reflection: What does this look like in my life? I need to remind myself daily that Christ is my constant companion. He shares my joy, provides comfort when I’m down, guides me when I’m challenged, and strengthens me when I’m overwhelmed.*

### Week of June 14, 2020

**Romans 5:3-5**

**...suffering produces endurance, and endurance produces character, and character produces hope, and hope does not disappoint us...**

*Example Reflection: What does this look like in my life? Life is not without its challenges. My advantage in facing those challenges is knowing that God is there to help me work through them. And by working through those challenges with God I will come out on the other side a stronger person and Christian.*

### Week of June 21, 2020

**So do not be afraid; you are of more value than many sparrows.**

*Example Reflection: What does this look like in my life? I worry too much! I need to trust in God’s love for me more.*

### Week of June 28, 2020

**Romans 6:23**

**For the wages of sin is death, but the free gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord.**

*Example Reflection: What does this look like in my life? Eternal life is a gift from God. I can show my appreciation for that gift by living my life in a way that pleases God. There are many other ways I can show my appreciation, I just need to identify them.*

## ZOOM

**What is a Zoom?** Zoom is a web-based video conferencing tool with a local, desktop client and a mobile app that allows users to meet online, **with or without video**.

**There are 3 ways to join a Zoom meeting:**

1. **With the Zoom app** on your desktop/laptop computer, personal tablet or mobile smart phone.
2. **Through a link** via your email invitation.
3. **By dialing in** using your telephone and joining the meeting using audio only.

**From the Zoom app: (personal tablet or mobile smart phone)**

1. Download and open the Zoom App.
2. Click "Join a Meeting."
3. Enter Meeting ID (provided by host).
4. Enter Password (provided by host).
5. When prompted, you will need to allow Zoom to "access mic" and "access camera."
6. You may select to "Join Audio" and "Start Video" if you choose to talk or be seen during a Zoom meeting.



**From the Zoom app or Zoom homepage: (personal computer: desktop or laptop).**

1. Go to [www.zoom.com](http://www.zoom.com) (zoom homepage) or the Zoom app.
2. Click the "Join a Meeting" tab. You can find the tab on the top right corner of the homepage.
3. Enter Meeting ID (provided by host).
4. Enter Password (provided by host).
5. When prompted, you will need to allow Zoom to "access mic" and "access camera."
6. You may select to "Join Audio" and "Start Video" if you choose to talk or be seen during a Zoom meeting.

**From an Email Invitation:**

1. You will receive an email invitation from the meeting host.
2. Click on the link in the email (you can join using a PC, Mac, iOS or Android device).
3. You should be taken directly to the meeting.
  - a. If not, go to [www.zoom.com](http://www.zoom.com), click on "join a meeting" and then enter in the Meeting ID and password located in the invitation.

**From your telephone:**

1. In the invitation you receive, there will be a telephone number that you can call if you do not have access to a computer or a mobile device.
  - a. It will look something like this: +1 312 626 6799 US (Chicago).
  - b. Once you dial in, you will be asked to dial in the password.


