# THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR BRAD

<sup>8</sup> So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid. Mark 16:8

Alleluia, Christ is Risen! Christ is Risen Indeed, **ALLELUIA!**

By the time you are reading this, we are knee-deep in the Easter season. Which might sound strange to some because they may think that Easter happened on April 4th - and that is partly true. We celebrated Easter Sunday on April 4th but now we are in the 50 days of Easter, where the disciples are learning to live without Jesus being present on a daily basis but also Jesus showing up here and there to remind them they are never truly alone. If you read any of the resurrection stories, Jesus shows up multiple times when the disciples are hiding behind locked doors because they are terrified of what might happen to them if the religious leaders found them. After all, if they are willing to kill Jesus then surely they would have no problem killing his followers. Back to my point - Jesus shows up multiple times to remind the disciples they aren't alone except in the Gospel of Mark where the author leaves it all up in the air. Look at verse 8 again

***<sup>8</sup>So they went out and fled from the tomb, for terror and amazement had seized them; and they said nothing to anyone, for they were afraid. Mark 16:8***

We get words like terror, amazement and fear (afraid). That's how Mark leaves it. There is no neat and tidy ending, there is no Jesus showing up multiple times to reassure the disciples (at least the men; the women already believed) that the story was true. No Jesus joining the disciples on the beach for a breakfast of fish

and bread or calling out to Peter to cast his net on the other side to get more fish.

No, we get confusion, loose ends and uncertainty. Like a TV show that gets canceled before the producer can write a proper ending. Scholars have argued for centuries over whether or not that was the true ending; someone even went back and tied up the loose ends so it seems more complete.

Personally, I like the abrupt ending. I like it left open to the reader to think about what might have happened. Did the women go to Galilee like they were instructed? Did the men follow them? How long did it take? We are left to draw our own conclusions and I think that fits us in 2021. We've encountered so many abrupt endings, so many false starts and do-overs that it almost feels natural.

Perhaps, it's time to embrace the do-overs as a way to move forward rather than as something that holds us back. Perhaps, we see them as opportunities to learn so we can know better. Perhaps, we don't need everything neatly wrapped up for us because it's in the unknown that we grow the most. God is waiting for us in the midst of all things, both the unknown and the known. May you continue to have a blessed Easter season!

Alleluia! Christ is Risen!  
Christ is Risen indeed,

Thank you to the multiple church members who reached out to financially support the projects of the Garden Team. Your support is greatly appreciated!



## PEACE LUTHERAN CEMETERY

Located just south of the city, the Peace Lutheran Cemetery began in 1885 when a strip of land next to the Northwestern Railroad track and the Town Road was donated to Peace Lutheran Church by a Mr. Ebernau. By 1960, that strip of land had expanded to cover 16 acres. I would safely guess that many members of Peace Lutheran Church have a loved one eternally resting in this cemetery.

Peace Lutheran Cemetery, is currently working to find a new groundskeeper. This process began last year and was filled for a very short period of time. 

**<sup>33</sup>I will sing to the Lord as long as I live; I will praise my God while I have my being.**


*This is a wondrous world that God has given us in which to live. Help me, Lord, to take time to enjoy its beauty and work to preserve it for future generations.*



## AT-HOME COMMUNION


