THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR BRAD

What are you thankful for? That question seems appropriate for this time of year, doesn't it? After all we are in the month of November, which for many, is synonymous with being thankful.

No doubt you have many things to be thankful for and I hope that you are able to name them, claim them and, when possible, let others know what you are thankful for.

Something that has been going around social media is a challenge to name three things a day for seven days that you are thankful for. I probably won't name 21 things now, but I do want to share some things I have been thankful for in the past few weeks.

1) I'm thankful for a dedicated staff at Peace who work well together and are willing to help out, often before they are asked and has taken on different tasks in this time of change.

2) I'm thankful for our new staff that the Leadership Team has hired and brought on board after identifying areas and needs that could benefit from paid staff.

3) I'm thankful for a Leadership Team that has a great vision for Peace and who are willing to work to help make their ideas a reality. They are a dedicated group who has the best interest of the entire Peace community in mind as they do their work.

I have the pleasure of doing weekly chapel with our preschool, interacting with our Sunday School youth and teaching our TRANSIT students.

6) I'm thankful for events like Oktoberfest where we can show off our church and the things we can do when we work together. I'm also thankful for the ability to open our facility up to so many different groups of people. If you stop and think about it, we have hundreds of people who use our building each week for something other than worship.

7) I'm thankful for the kindness and grace that is constantly shown to my wife and me by the people of Peace. On a regular basis all of you remind me why I chose to accept the call to Peace and you make me grateful for the work of the Holy Spirit guiding us together.

That is only the beginning of the things I am thankful for. I am most thankful to God for your presence in God's church, in the community we call Peace. We are blessed to be a blessing to those around us. Let us never take for granted all of the things we have to be thankful for in our lives.







Sunday Schoolers follow The Good Shepherd.

The next time you're at Peace Lutheran, take a walk down the main corridor and check out the wall display across from the Sunday School office. It's our annual project that pictures all our students – and it's a very impressive flock, indeed. The sheep and lettering were made by our Middle School class and they did a ovine-ly fantastic job! They just wanna be some sheep, baa, baa, baa, baa, baa!

Curriculum

We completed our first unit on prayer with the distribution of Prayer Card Decks to all our younger kids. Each deck includes 31 different prayers that are coupled with 31 Bible verses related to the topic of the prayer. So there's a prayer for every day of the month. The decks were produced and assembled with the help of our Middle Schoolers (who will be happy to make more if any members of the congregation want their own Prayer Card Deck). We also put up a display of Prayer Posters in the Social Center where Sunday Schoolers gather before going to their individual class rooms.

Bibles

In October, we distributed Beginner Bibles to our Pre-K students and 3rd Graders got Spark intermediate NRSV Bibles. All students new to Peace Lutheran Sunday School also got age-appropriate Bibles. We'll be devoting time in our studies to help kids understand how The Bible is structured and how to find Books, Chapters and Verses.

Christmas Program

We'll be devoting a lot of time in November to our annual Sunday School Christmas Program, which will take place during the **10:30am service on Sunday, December 16**. As usual, we will have a full rehearsal in the morning on **Saturday, December 15**. Please mark these dates on your calendar – and encourage your child's participation in this special service. Being part of the program is an excellent way to learn both the story and the meaning of Christmas.




There's Always Room for More...

Greetings Families and Friends of Peace Christian Preschool!

It's November already and that means we're gearing up for the chilly weather and the fun holiday seasons. We will host our annual November canned food drive for the Lutheran Food Pantry, teachers will begin to practice for the December's holiday concert and we will take the opportunity to reflect on gratefulness and thanksgiving.

For the past 8 years the preschool has participated in an annual canned food drive for the Lutheran Food Pantry. We ask our families to consider a donation of two canned food items. Each year we are impressed that the majority of the families willingly participate. The children have a good time carting the food items up to the sanctuary in our Radio Flyer wagon. From the wagon the food items are placed around the altar with the other food items that church members contribute. It is a good opportunity for the children to learn about helping other people in our community.

We have holiday concerts coming up the second week of December and that means that the children will begin singing holiday songs in early November. We have gone back to hosting concerts for both the 3K and the 4K children. Last year I presented the idea to not have the 3K children perform a holiday concert. The premise for the suggestion is that studies show that most children at the age of three are not ready to perform for an audience and the experience is more traumatic for the children and entertaining only for the adults. Additionally, their classroom time could be much better spent engaged in more meaningful learning experiences. Well...that change was not well received among the parents and after much negative feedback the 3K children will perform for Christmas again. And so we go back to the way things were.

Many of you are already aware that I have taken a position working for Peace Lutheran Church directly. My new position with Peace is officially called the Curator of Congregational Ministries. I will split my work time between the morning and the afternoons. Each morning, Monday through Friday I will work for the preschool. In the afternoons I will move upstairs and work for the church. I am still learning and growing in my upstairs role. My goal is to be extremely helpful to the church in organizing and encouraging our members to be active and serve. I am fully aware I have much to learn! Just a tip for those who have advice for me, I respond extremely well to "constructive" criticism.



