THOUGHTS FROM PASTOR BRAD

4 Rejoice in the Lord always; again I will say, Rejoice. 5 Let your gentleness be known to everyone. The Lord is near. 6 Do not worry about anything, but in everything by prayer and supplication with thanksgiving let your requests be made known to God. 7 And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will guard your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus.

"Rejoice always, and again I say rejoice!"

Since it's November, it would only make sense that I write an article about giving thanks or being joyful or any number of topics that could be tied into Thanksgiving. If I'm being honest, though, I'm not sure I'm really thankful right now, or at least as thankful as I should be. I am guessing that most of you probably can relate to that feeling. We are in the midst of a pandemic that has turned our country and the world into chaos, we are closing in on an election that has been tumultuous at best, too often we are not treating our friends, family or even complete strangers the way they deserve to be treated, we make plans only to have those plans shredded like confetti.

How is it possible to be thankful or joyful at a time like this? I get it. I also get that we are to trust that God is in the midst of all things, that God will bring peace among us, a peace that only God can bring. I honestly believe that we need to all take a moment and find a moment of joy that is around us. They exist. Trust me. I asked my Confirmation students to talk about a joy moment in the midst of this chaos and they were each able to find multiple moments of joy.

One of my moments of joy is the opportunity to connect with people I might not have otherwise. I reached out to a few of my college friends and we had a Zoom conversation that I know we otherwise would never have had. I've been able to attend worship at many of my seminary classmates congregations and that has brought much joy to me.

Every November I try to write down one thing I'm thankful for each day as a reminder of all that God has given me. This year, I'm even more committed to that idea. Would you join me in doing this? Here is what I'm thinking - each day write down one item you are thankful for and be as specific or general as you want and put it in a jar. On November 26th, take the jar and share what you are thankful for in whatever way works for you. Do you think you can think of 26 reasons to give thanks? Make it a part of your daily routine. In a time when it is hard to find joy I think it is imperative we make sure to recognize the reason to be joyful.

The Lord is near. You are loved. Let the peace of God, found only in Christ Jesus, wash over you and guide you.

TRANSFORMING THE CONFERENCE ROOM INTO A FIRESIDE ROOM

The room across from the church office has served a variety of purposes over years. Just in the last year it has been the offering counting room, a place for the choir to warm up before singing on Sunday, the leadership team meeting room, the confirmation meeting room, the staff meeting room, a place for fun events like lunches, bingo and cribbage and a place to stop and get a hot or cold beverage during the day. For as useful as the room has been, it was also equally dated.

With a modest budget allotted for the task, the busy conference room has been transformed into a welcoming Fireside Room.

The most visible update is the addition of a cozy electric fireplace. Additional work completed in the

room included painting the pink tiles a beautiful navy blue and then painting the brown shelving a soft white. The mismatched tall tables and chairs were spray painted so they'd be all the same color. Both the tall chairs and the table chairs were given new upholstery so they would match and the armchair pillows were created from the remaining fabric. Navy furniture covers were purchased for the red chairs and an area rug was added to tie in the space around the fireplace with the chairs.


These tasks were laborious but very rewarding. While the new room is currently appreciated by staff, we look forward to a time when we can gather again in larger groups and enjoy the space together.





SOCIALLY RESPONSIBLE LUNCHEONS AT PEACE

We hear many stories of individuals suffering from something termed as Quarantine Fatigue. Equally disheartening are the stories of isolation as people do their part to keep the community healthy. We have also learned that it is possible to offer safe ways to publicly gather in controlled environments. Beginning in November, Kim Blake-Jungwirth and Heather Miller will begin hosting very small luncheons at Peace. There will be no more than 5 guests invited to attend a particular lunch.

What socially responsible safety measures will be in place?

Each guest will be seated at their own properly sanitized table. Each table will be more than six feet from any guest. Except while eating, guests will be asked to wear a facemask.

BISHOP-ELECT

On September 26, the East Central Synod of Wisconsin met for a virtual synod assembly and the main item on the agenda was to elect a Bishop for a six year term. It was a Spirit-filled process and on the fifth ballot we elected Pastor Anne Edison-Albright to be our next Bishop. We give thanks for Bishop Gerald Mansholt and the service he provided for our synod over the past six years.



Bishop-Elect Anne Edison-Albright currently serves as the Director of College Ministries and College Pastor at Luther College in Decorah, IA. She has served the Luther College community since 2016. She previously served as pastor at Redeemer Lutheran Church in Stevens Point, WI, her first call, from 2010-2016. Her pastoral ministry in both Wisconsin and Iowa have been marked by passion for ecumenical and interfaith collaboration; community organizing; faith formation for all ages; collegiality and joy in bringing congregations together; and encouraging and equipping lay and rostered leaders. The Rev. Edison-Albright has also served as a hospital chaplain, a pastoral intern at the international congregation in Bratislava, Slovakia, and a summer missionary/English teacher in Chu Zhou, China. Before becoming a pastor Anne was a high school English and English as a Second Language teacher in Houston, TX.

Anne received Bachelor of Arts degrees in English and journalism from Michigan State University in East Lansing, MI (2003) and an MDiv from Yale Divinity School in New Haven, CT (2008). She's married to Sean Edison-Albright and mom to Walter and Sally. She enjoys gardening, baking, embroidery and listening to podcasts to refresh and renew her. Following her election as bishop she stated, "Coming back to the East Central Synod of Wisconsin feels like coming home, and I am looking forward to reconnecting and also getting to know the synod in a very new way. I am honored and grateful for the opportunity to serve alongside you as bishop; to encourage and equip you as leaders and to be part of the good and vital work you are doing every day. I am deeply thankful for the ministry and leadership of Bishop Mansholt, and pray for transition blessings for him and Anita and the whole family. I ask for prayers for me, Sean, Walter and Sally, too!".

Bishop-elect Edison-Albright will take office on December 1.

How do I pay?

You can set up a PrestoPay account in your [shopwithscrip](http://shopwithscrip.com) account and pay online with a \$0.15 transaction fee, or you can pay by cash or check made out to "Peace Lutheran Church." All payments must be received by noon on every other Monday to be included in the order. Orders are placed every other week and delivered to church by Friday on the week of the order.

All physical cards are picked up from a volunteer located in the narthex before or after most services OR available in the office. On-hand orders are ready for immediate pick-up.

We have the following Scrip on-hand available for immediate purchase:


